For those who can read the music: Here's B.B. King's famous solo on CONGA BRAVA, recorded on March 6th, 1940:



CORRECTIONS to the Victor 40 - 42 volume:

Entry 41-21: The Victor number 27617 is false MID-BROWN-SKIN GAL and JUMP FOR JOY (-1) are both on Victor 27517. (Aasland)
 Entry 42-1: PERDIDO is also on RCA VPM-6042-1. (Aasland)

A D D I T I O N S:

Alamac QSR-2404 also released on Alamac 1800 (Aasland)
 Entry 41-32: All selections also on Diversity 3004 and on Joker 3120. (Wilson)
 Extreme Rarities ER-1002 "HOT JAZZ ON FILMS" Vol. 1 should be added to the "Microgroove Listing" section. Has two DE tracks: Dec41: Hot Chocolate/Jam Session (Entry 41-22). (Aasland)
 The label Jazz Moderne (issue number?) has 26Jul40: Harlem Airshaft/...etc.../2Nov40: Pyramid/...etc... (Sanfilippo)
 Black Jack 3004 has 22Jul42: Things Ain't What They Used To Be/(Balance not known). Add to the "Microgroove Listing" section. (Aasland)
 The AFRS transcription "Basic Musical Library" Vol. P-466 has 16May45: Every Hour On The Hour/5Jul42: Time's A-Wastin'/(Balance not by DE). (Aasland)
 Entry 40-47: The Jazz Society AS-520/-521 recordings in Japan on Philips BT-5279/-5280. (Hallstrom)
 Dick Bakker's "Micrography" reports a.o. two Japanese RCA sets: "The Duke Ellington Story" 1940-1945 on RCA RA-36 - RA-44, beginning with YOU, YOU DARLING up to and including MIDRIF, and "The Essence Of Small Groups" on RCA RA-75 & RA-78 with Hodges, Bigard and Stewart units. Another RCA release, CL-42237, has selections from this Victor period.

D I S C U S S I O N S / C O M M E N T S:

Could the Jazz Guild 1006 selections listed as from 7 Sep 40 (see entry 40-24) be the same as from 5 Oct. 40 (see entry 40-41), or vice versa? (Hallstrom)
 Entry 40-47: There is no "Lake Inn" in Fargo. Who dreamed up this location? (Towers)
